

# DANGEROUS GOODS

If you have packed or are carrying any dangerous goods you must declare them when you check-in.

## FORBIDDEN

The civil aviation safety regulations forbids passengers to travel with most dangerous goods



Bleach/ Oven Cleaner



Butane cartridges and refills/  
gas bottles



Car/ motorbike batteries



Flares/ gunpowder



Party poppers/ fireworks



Fuel and petrol/oil-based paint



Gas canister exceeding 28g/50ml



Insect sprays



Paint stripper/ hydrogen peroxide



Pepper spray/ mace\*



Self-balancing boards



Sparklers/ firelighters

Above are some common items that are classified as dangerous goods — passengers are forbidden to carry them on an aircraft.

\*carriage can be approved for Law Enforcement Agencies with prior airline approval

## CHECK WITH AIRLINE

Some dangerous goods are permitted provided certain carriage requirements have been met

Avalanche rescue pack



Batteries (spare)/ power banks



Camping stoves



CO2 gas cartridges



Dry Ice



Engines (internal combustion)



Heat producing devices



Life Jackets (self-inflating)



Medical use Oxygen



Power tools
